A. Experience and perspectives of international missions in Eurasia

1. The "missions boom" of the '90s and its results. Analyses.

2. An analysis of differences between the expectations and approaches of national churches and Western missionaries and ministries. The current needs of the evangelical church in the former Soviet Union, and opportunities for the Western church and mission groups to help.

3. An analysis of the investment in national churches and ministries vs. outcomes and results since the collapse of the former Soviet Union and today. Methods and models of how national ministries should move from financial dependence to effective and progressive self-sustained ministries.

4. An analysis of the right strategies for missions in the FSU today. What needs to be done in order to help the national church continue to grow? Models of effective partnerships.

5. The possibilities and new opportunities for missions work in the former Soviet Union: from utopia to realistic plans, from traditional approaches to modern forms of international partnerships in reaching, empowering and equipping the Next Generation for progressive outreach ministries in the FSU and EE

B. The relevance of international Christian partnerships in the former Soviet Union today

1. The geopolitical significance of the region in light of the worldwide economic and political crisis.

2. The spiritual situation in the former USSR after the fall of communism. The state and role (position) of the evangelical church in post-Soviet society.

3. The anti-evangelical and anti-Western agenda of the Russian Orthodox Church and its role in monopolizing the religious sphere in Russia and its influence on neighboring countries.

4. Russia's influence on its neighbors: imperial ideology and anti-Western sentiments.

5. The fate of democracy and religious freedom in the post-Soviet sphere.

6. Post-Soviet countries on the road to social catastrophe: the demographic crisis, AIDS and other diseases, alcoholism, drug addiction, street children, human trafficking and the role of the national church in solving and addressing these issues.

7. Russia's and FSU's transformation from "communism to consumerism."

8. The role of Islam in Russia and the countries of the former USSR. Strategies for the evangelical church and mission organizations in the countries and regions of the former Soviet Union, which have a predominant Islamic influence.
